



Oakley Green, Fifield and District Local Business Action Plan 2010





Foreword

Local Businesses,

We are delighted to present the Oakley Green, Fifield and District **Local Business Action Plan**.

How did we get here? Well in early 2008, after confirming that there was sufficient local interest in developing a Community Plan, the effort was launched at the end of March.

Since then, seven work groups made up of local volunteers have met regularly. They initially undertook a lot of research. They then went on to design, deliver, collect and analyse two surveys in order to establish exactly what local residents and businesses wanted to see maintained and what they would like to see improved in our area. Further Public consultation took place to make sure we were on the right track. Contact was made with external stakeholders and service providers to provide an accuracy and reality check. The Community Action Plan, based on the Residents Survey, was published and copies were delivered free to every household in December 2009. And now, we are publishing the Local Business Action Plan and copies will be delivered free to all the local businesses that were contacted.

But this is really just the beginning. For the first time in our area we now have local Action Plans and a blueprint to enhance our futures, based firmly on the wishes expressed by respondents to the surveys. Now we need to execute the Actions identified and monitor our progress in delivery! This will require more hard work and significant understanding, support and cooperation from a lot of organisations, most importantly our three main service providers of The Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead Council, Bray Parish Council and Thames Valley Police.

So the bottom line is that success in implementation and enhancing our daily lives lies with our local residents and businesses. We need more volunteers to come forward and help us deliver. Please note that it is never too late to become involved. There are many people to thank for the efforts so far and many are listed at the back of the Community Action Plan and this the Local Businesses Action Plan. But all of this was made possible by generous financial support by Bray Parish Council, to whom we formally record our thanks here.

The area covered by this Action Plan is substantially the Oakley Green and Fifield Electoral Ward, excluding Hawthorn Hill and St. Leonard's Hill - as depicted on the map on the opposite page and includes the following roads:

Bishops Farm Close, Blackbird Lane, Coningsby Lane, Dedworth Road (to Fairacres Farm), Down Place, Drift Road (from The Bolt to Braywood Cottage), Ferndale Park, Fifield Lane, Fifield Road, Forest Green Road (to Blackbird Lane), Ledger Lane, Manor Grove, Meadow Way, Oakley Green Road, Stewart Close, Tarbay Lane, Water Oakley, Windsor Road (from Fifield Road turn to Oakley Green Road turn).


Local Business Survey

VISION

Achieve a good understanding of the needs and wishes of local businesses in order to underpin the Plan's legitimacy

There was just one question in the Residents Survey conducted in the Autumn of 2008 which specifically related to local Business

Q26: If you are involved in a local Business, would you be interested in paying for advertising space? (....in a Community Communication)



This Survey revealed that there were a significant number of businesses operating in our area, so in early January 2009, a new Work Group called Local Business was formed. This was in addition to the other six work groups of Children & Youths, Communications, Community Safety, Environment, Roads & Transport and Social & Recreational which had been formed in early 2008 when the project first started.

Initial research was carried out and more than 70 local Businesses were identified as operating within the Oakley Green, Fifield and District area - ranging from sole traders to organisations employing more than 100 people. Of these, many are owned by locals, whilst others employ local residents and thus form an integral part of the community. The industries range from agricultural/equestrian to catering, manufacturing, leisure and distribution.


In the summer of 2009, a **Local Business Survey** with 18 questions was compiled and distributed, in order to start communication with this significant and important group. We asked business owners about why they chose to locate in our area and asked them to describe issues and problems they face, as well as their ideas on how these could be resolved or improved.

Some themes emerged which also came out in the Residents Survey – namely issues about public transport, police presence, traffic and poor broadband coverage in some areas.




Q1: How long has your business been located in the Oakley Green and Fifield area?




It is apparent that many businesses are well established.

Q2: How would you classify your business?




There are a broad range of business types in our area—and some surprises too!

In total, several hundred individuals are employed in our area, so it is important to be aware of their needs.


Q4: How did your business come to be situated in this area?



Q5: How do people working at your premises normally come to work?




Q6: Where do these people travel from?




Q7: Would your business benefit from an improved bus service?

Q8: Do you suffer from flooding problems? If so, where?




Q9: Do you think speeding traffic is a problem in the area? If so on which roads?




Q10: Would you support speed control measures? If so, what measures?


Q11a: How do you rate standards of water services?




Q11b: How do you rate standards of electricity services?




Q11c: How do you rate standards of gas services?




Q11d: How do you rate standards of recycling services?




Q11e. How do you rate standards of mobile phone services?




Q11f: How do you rate standards of main drainage services?



Q11g: How do you rate standards of refuse collection?




Q11h: How do you rate standards of road surfacing services?



What Next?



To put in place an organisation and processes to deliver the actions identified in the Community Action Plan

A huge amount of time, energy and effort has gone into consulting with local residents and businesses and developing and publishing our Community and Local Business Action Plans. Some Quick Wins have been identified and some have been delivered already. But... most of the time and effort expended will be to no avail if we do not identify who is responsible for making sure the plan is implemented. Looking further into the future, the plan will need to be reviewed and updated as circumstances and needs change over time.

It is therefore essential that organisations and processes are put in place to make sure the plans are delivered, monitored and reviewed at an appropriate time. In order to underpin this, the following actions are recommended.

- Encourage existing work group members to continue to serve in order to maintain continuity
- Encourage new volunteers to join these groups
- Each work group to prepare regular progress reports
- This includes the Local Business Work Group
