Easter Trail and Quiz Sheet

The OGAFCA Easter Trail route includes the Oakley Green Road, Fifield Village and some footpaths which could be muddy if it is wet. If it is too long for your family just do the Mini Trail and if you want, you can always do the Extended Trail another day.

- The route clues start in Fifield as a **Mini Trail** around Fifield and the **Extended Trail** continues to Oakley Green across the fields.
- There will be **11 letters** to look out for in **Fifield** from **Good Friday to Easter Monday** which when you find them make a **Mystery Words**.
- And don't forget to **take a pencil / pen** to answer the **Quiz questions** on the way!

All entries will be included in the Easter Egg prize draw even if you just did the Mini Trail!

At the end keep your answers to the quiz and mystery word and we will email out the correct answers and let you know if you were a lucky Easter Egg winner after the Easter weekend.

Disclaimer:

Please note that you will be taking part in the OGAFCA Easter Trail and Quiz at your own risk. All participants should act safely and children should be supervised throughout to avoid and minimise injury. Particular care should be taken when walking along and crossing roads.

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Start from the Bus shelter in Fifield:

Q. The 16A bus runs from Maidenhead to Windsor but where does it stop on the way?

A. Holyport, Fifield and Dedworth

Walk past the little Village Green.

Q. How many trees are on the Green?

A.5

What is the speed limit through Fifield?

A. 30mph

At the end of the pavement **cross** the road to Fairview Cottage.

Q. When was Fairview Cottage built?

A. 1870

Q. This cottage was one of several in the area built by the first Belgian Ambassador to England, Sylvain Van De Weyer for his workers. The family crest VW tells us that but where is it?

A. On the front of the house

Turn left and walk towards the post box.

Q. There is a sign for Fifield Way Cottages. How many cottages are there?

A.14

Q. What time does the post get collected in Fifield on a Saturday?

A.10.30am

Continue walking past Stewart Close and at the Footpath sign at Deep Meadows turn right and walk up the drive. By the wooden gate turn left at another footpath sign.

Q. Who should not use this footpath?

A. Horses

Continue along the footpath, it may be a bit muddy.

Q. As you walk along the footpath if you see a steam train what number is it?

A.1016

At the end of the footpath take the footpath between Blenheims and Ledger Cottage and go through a kissing gate.

Q. Who will be Prosecuted?

A. Trespassers

Continue through the field along the footpath and through another kissing gate and at the road cross over and turn left towards Fifield.

Q. How should drivers drive through Fifield?

A. Carefully

Walk past the Fifield Inn and towards Stewart Close

Q. What is the drawing of on the sign for the Fifield Inn?

A. A polo pony and player

Q. Where can people stay in Fifield for Bed and Breakfast?

A. Victoria Cottages

Q. What should you "Beware of" at the house on the corner of Stewart Close?

A. The cat

This is the end of the Mini Trail.

Q. Have you found the letters and discovered the mystery words?

A. EASTER BUNNY

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Extended Trail

Continue past **Stewart Close** and turn **right** at the footpath sign up to a gate and continue straight following along hedge line across the **polo fields** till you reach the bridge after the **third** field.

Cross the bridge and bear **right** and continue to follow the footpath along hedge **do not** take the footpath sign leading back to Oakley Green Road.

Q. Can you name the tree to your left in the middle of the field which has acorns in the Autumn?

A. Oak

Continue along the footpath by the hedge bearing **left** at the corner (there is a signpost) to the next footpath signpost by the **pond** where you need to take the footpath to the **right** along a track.

At the next signpost take the broken sign direction to the **right diagonally** across the crop field.

Q. How many windows are there on the front of the grand house looking across the fields.

A. 9

Continue through a grass field to a kissing gate over a bridge and through the next kissing gate.

Q. Who sponsors the Kissing Gate?

A. East Berkshire Ramblers Association

Follow the footpath (there are 2 footpaths) across the field **diagonally** to a kissing gate, go through it and pass over another wooden bridge. On the other side turn **right** and follow the footpath along a gravel drive to the Oakley Green Road.

When you reach the Oakley Green Road **cross over** and turn **right** and continue walking along the pavement towards Fifield.

Q. What are you not allowed to do at Marshal Place?

A. Park or Turn

Continue past 2 properties on the left whose names refer to a cluster of trees.

Q. Can you name these 2 properties.

A. Forest Farm and Woodlands

And after the footpath sign you will come to the bend where you need to **cross over** the road with care.

Q. How many black and white bollards are on this bend?

A. 8

On your **right** is Braywood Linn which was built in 1870 by Sylvain Van de Weyer who built New Lodge and bought most of the land from New lodge down to the river known as New Lodge Estate.

It was originally the Braywood Inn where the Estate workers would get together and you can still see the Van de Weyer Estaste crest.

As you continue along the road and see how many of the Van de Weyer Estaste crests you see today on the houses including the Lodge Gates which originally lead up to Braywood Church part of Braywood Parish created in 1871.

On the way there is a bus stop outside Kimbers Farm.

Q. What is the approximate journey time by bus to Windsor from this bus stop?

A. 22 minutes

Q. As you continue along the road there is another Van de Weyer house opposite Withy Cottage but the crest has been painted over so it is not easy to see. Can you name the house?

A. Oakley Cottage

Continue walking along the road and **do not** take the footpath sign after the White House.

Q. How many Remembrance Day wreaths are there at the War Memorial.

A. 6

Q. Near the bus stop by the school there is a bench in memory of Esther Rickards where did she live?

A. Tarbay

Continue on towards Braywood Cricket Club.

Q. If you want to contact someone at the club what number do you call?

A. 01628 633503

Continue walking to the cross roads.

Q. What does FPC stand for?

A. Fifiield Polo Club

Q. What is in the front garden near Fifiield House Farm that is to do with the royal family?

A. the Heads of the Queen and Prince Phillip

Q. That is the speed limit on this road?

A. 40 mph

At the cross roads head back towards Fifiield.

Well done you have completed the Easter Trail !! And finally....

Q. Can you remember how many Van de Weyer crests you saw including the one in Fifiield?

A. 9 in total (7 plus Oakley Cottage and Fairview)

Q. Kissing Gates are gates that open for walkers to go through without livestock escaping. Can you remember how many Kissing Gates you went through?

A. 5 (2 in Fifiield and 3 in Oakley Green)
