Community Lateral Flow Testing

We are setting up lateral flow testing sites for critical and key workers, and anyone who needs to leave home for work or crucial activity.


The new variant of COVID-19 is spreading through our community, and one in three COVID-19 patients don't present any symptoms.

Lateral flow testing (LFT) can identify positive COVID-19 cases in people who are not showing symptoms. This will help to reduce the spread of COVID-19 in our community by preventing these people from unknowingly spreading the virus.

When the LFT sites are up and running, eligible residents will get an email or text message inviting them to get a lateral flow test at a local test centre.

Frimley Health and Care

A joint letter from the NHS and council leaders within the Frimley Health and Care System, which supports health services in the borough, has been published on our [website today](#).

The borough has high levels of COVID-19 infection and cases are still rising. The pressure on our NHS services is greater now than it has been at any previous stage in the pandemic, with an increase in the number of local people dying from the virus.

Update to GP surgery services

Local GP surgeries are a critical part of the NHS and care for the most vulnerable members of our community. To keep patients and staff safe, GP practices are currently prioritising those most at risk from the impact of Covid and those with the greatest health needs.



[Minor illness](#) and conditions that can be dealt with by community pharmacies will **not be seen** by your GP. If you are feeling unwell and it's not an emergency, the [Know Where to Go When Feeling Unwell](#) guide will give you advice on where to go for help.


GP surgeries remain open for any urgent and on-going health needs but please don't call your local practice to ask about the COVID-19 vaccine.

Ask for ANI

Ask for ANI (Action Needed Immediately) is a new Government codeword scheme to provide a discreet way for victims of domestic abuse to signal that they need emergency help.

Victims of domestic abuse in need of help can 'Ask for ANI' when they next visit their local pharmacy. A trained pharmacist will provide a private space where they can understand if the victim needs to speak to the police or would like help to access support services such as a national or local domestic abuse helpline.




The scheme will initially be available in all 2,300 Boots pharmacies across the UK as well as in over 250 independent pharmacies.


Suggestions for discussion will be added to a future agenda if appropriate.

If you are out of work and struggling to find employment, you can get free, local support and guidance from Career Springboard East Berkshire.




Volunteers and professional career coaches will help you identify your strengths and build your confidence.

We regularly hold consultations to get your views on proposals within the Royal Borough.




